

Headteacher's Comment:

Dear Parents/Carers

Over the last two weeks, the teaching staff and members of the SLT have had their performance management meetings. During this time, we've all had the opportunity to reflect on the successes and next steps from the last academic year.

Following the completion of these meetings, there was an overwhelming sense of pride shared by both the staff and myself. When we look back at the journey we have all been part of, it's incredible to see how far we've come. Two years ago, many of us took the brave step of leaving the comfort of our previous schools to join the Trust and Mr Duff at a time when Hogarth was, at the lower end of the *Requires Improvement* standard.

The school's progress, however, is not solely down to the efforts of the staff. It is also a reflection of the support we have received from you, your families, and most importantly, the children—who come in every day with the biggest smiles on their faces.

This half term, we have seen a significant uplift in attendance, which I wanted to share and celebrate with you. We are currently sitting at 95% attendance, which is in line with the national average. Two years ago, this figure was just below 89%. The more time your children spend in school, the greater the progress they make—something that aligns perfectly with the improved assessment scores we have seen.

Even more impressively, persistent absenteeism (children with less than 90% attendance) has dropped from 38% two years ago to just 12% this term. While this is still too high, it represents a clear shift in attitudes and mindsets towards education here at Hogarth.

In slightly less positive news, I need to share that Mrs. Connor, who has been instrumental in driving whole-school improvement at Hogarth over the last two years, will be leaving us for the foreseeable future. She has been seconded by the Trust to take on the role of Deputy Headteacher at Kelvedon Hatch Community Primary School.

I have no doubt that Mrs. Connor will embrace this new opportunity and offer Kelvedon the same wisdom and enthusiasm that we have benefited from during her time with us. From the heart, Hogarth wishes her every success in her new adventure—we know we'll see her again soon.

Well done to all of the children who took part in the Welly Walk this week! The feedback from the (very tired!) children, parents, and staff was that it was a wonderful opportunity to get out in the fresh air as a whole school and see our older pupils acting as fantastic role models.

This week, we also welcomed back Dancing Don for our KS2 children, who performed some incredible routines linked to Black History Month. Our Reception children also joined in and were absolutely fabulous!

Finally, I would like to wish you all a wonderful two-week half-term break. I look forward to seeing everyone bright and early on Monday, 3rd November.
