

White Polo Shirt with or without the Hogarth Primary School logo for all year groups
Blue Gingham Check Dress
Grey or Black Tights, Grey, Black or White Socks
Black Shoes (No Trainers)

#### **PE Kit**

White T-Shirt Black Sport Shorts White Socks Plimsoles/Trainers

#### **Jewellery**

No jewellery permitted Watches allowed (from Year 3)

#### **Uniform Policy**

#### 1. Introduction

1.1 It is our school policy that all children wear uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event either inside, or outside of normal school hours.

#### 2. Aims and objectives

- 2.1 Our policy on school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:
  - Promotes a sense of pride in the school;
  - Engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school;
  - Is practical and smart;
  - Identifies the child with the school;
  - Makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
  - Is gender neutral;
  - Is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents.

## 3. Jewellery and hairstyles

- 3.1 We do not allow children to wear jewellery, fake nails, nail varnish or make-up in school. The exceptions to these rules are watches (from Year 3) and small objects of religious significance. Children are to remove these objects during P.E. and swimming.
- 3.2 All long hair should be tied back.
- 3.3 Dyed hair is not allowed.

#### 4. Footwear

4.1 Appropriate shoes are to be worn to school. The definition of appropriate is at the discretion of the Senior Leadership Team.

## 5. Physical Education

5.1 Children are to change into the appropriate clothing and footwear for physical education.

The definition of appropriate is at the discretion of the Senior Leadership Team.

## 6. Labelling

- 6.1 All items of uniform must be labelled with either name tapes or indelible marker pen.
- 6.2 P.E. kit must be sent in a name-labelled drawstring bag for hanging on a peg.

## 7. Non-compliance with school uniform policy

7.1 The Headteacher is allowed to discipline for breach of uniform policy. The school will consider discreetly why pupil is not adhering to the school uniform policy i.e. financial constraints etc.
